We Remember... Captain Albert Lee Kaiss (1940-2018)

I met Capt. Kaiss, the USS Missouri’s last commanding officer, about six years ago as a docent aboard the Battleship Missouri. His distinctive voice of authority caught my ear. “Captain Kaiss?” I hesitantly asked as he turned to greet me, “Hi, son! How are you doing?” he replied with a handshake.

All of the docents knew who he was from the video recordings of the ship’s history. CDR Larry Doong, USN Ret., the ship’s last Chief Engineer, told us that Capt. Kaiss was the finest commanding officer he had ever served under. We believed it.

Capt. Kaiss would generously give his time to our tour guides, answering our many questions and giving us valuable insight into his experiences. In 2013 a Make a Wish family was aboard while he was visiting and the child was elated to meet “a real captain.” Capt. Kaiss graciously interacted with the family and took pictures with them.

On his last visit to the ship in 2015, I was fortunate to escort him and his family. Being present while he told them stories about his time aboard ship was fascinating. He remembered his crew by their full names, even recalling details like their hometowns and their families. This included the last U.S. Marine who stood guard outside of the captain’s cabin before the ship’s decommissioning. It was amazing.

He was a remarkable gentleman and there will never be another one like him. “We remember...”

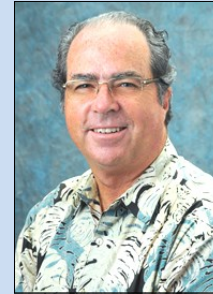
Giving Thanks and Helping Others

The Battleship Missouri is scheduled to undergo repairs and preservation of the after portion of the ship’s superstructure including the 03 and above level structures, mast, yardarms, and decks (see green area below).



The completed project is expected to last thirty-years with minimal maintenance and enhance the appearance and safety of the ship. This project is in alignment with our mission to preserve the Battleship Missouri and share her story and place in history.

The USS Missouri Memorial will remain open to visitors throughout the duration of the project with special accommodations made to ensure visitor access and public safety.
