73rd Anniversary of the End of WWII

The end of WWII on September 2, 1945 was an event that changed the world. The hard won peace was sealed with the signing of the instrument of surrender aboard the Battleship Missouri in Tokyo Bay on that historic day. The most destructive war in the history of mankind ended with the stroke of a pen and with words of reconciliation and hope.



General Douglas MacArthur, Supreme Commander of the Allied Forces, offered conciliatory words of hope on behalf of all war-torn nations:

"...It is my earnest hope and indeed the hope of all mankind that from this solemn occasion a better world shall emerge out of the blood and carnage of the past – a world founded upon faith and understanding – a world dedicated to the dignity of man and the fulfillment of his most cherished wish – for freedom, tolerance and justice...."

Please join us to commemorate the end of WWII and to also honor the 75th Anniversary of the establishment of the Japanese American 442nd Regimental Combat Team. The 442 became the most decorated unit of its size in U.S. military history. In less than two years of combat, the unit earned more than 18,000 awards, including 9,486 Purple Hearts, 4,000 Bronze Stars and 21 Medals of Honor.

Battleship Missouri Participates in Local Charity Walk

On Sat., May 19, 2018, twenty three representatives of the Battleship Missouri joined an estimated 7,000 participants in the 40th annual Hawaii Lodging and Tourism Association's 5.25 mile Charity Walk in Honolulu.

ADA Elevator Installation

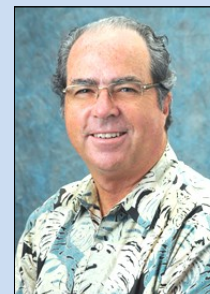
