Artifact of the Month: Apron, Riling Collection

It is not uncommon for museums to have artifacts in their collection where little is known other than the donor. Such is the case for this apron, created by WWII Missouri crew member Jackson Riling.

We know a great deal about Riling: he was aboard for the commissioning, WWII, the Surrender Ceremony, and even the return of the Turkish ambassador's body to Istanbul. Riling was part of the FA Division, which was tasked with operating the 5 in. AA Battery. This is most likely why Fire Controlman 2nd class badges were sewn onto the apron.

The apron itself is comprised of two standard issue black silk neckerchiefs that were sewn together. Great care was taken in the creation of pleating along the bottom of the apron and in the embroidered cross stitch pattern in red, white, and blue that frames the piece. Riling managed to find the time to sew this while deployed aboard the Missouri, but unfortunately that's all we know about the artifact. Whether this was something he made for himself or if it was intended as a gift for his wife, Joyce, has been lost to time.
